he University of Lome
was the venue for the
opening ceremony of the
maiden ANOCA Zone 3
Games, an exclusively
women's event. It also hosted the
competition venues.

The highly colourful event, featuring songs and parades, was staged at the Scène Bella Bellow of the University of Lome. It was graced by the President of ANOCA Zone 3, Jean YAMEOGO, the President of NOC Togo (CNO-TOGO), Deladem AKPAKI, Presidents of participating NOCs, former CNO-TOGO Presidents, and Benjamin BOUKPETI, Togo's sole Olympic medallist and ambassador of the ANOCA Zone 3 Games. An AFD-Paris 2024 Joint Mission was also present.

The 6 delegations at the Games, namely Burkina Faso, Benin, Ghana, Côte d'Ivoire, Nigeria and Togo, paraded happily and in solidarity at the official opening ceremony, clearly demonstrating their overwhelming joy through their active participation.






## ALL ABOUT CHAMPIONS

Many female athletes were outstanding and bagged medals during the maiden ANOCA Zone 3 Games held in Togo from 5 to 8 December 2023.





Sports disciplines included Basketball 3x3, Handball and Volleyball.

After a rugged competition that brought together senior female athletes, Côte d'Ivoire won gold in Basketball 3x3, ahead of Nigeria (silver) and Togo (bronze). According to observers, the Games were highly competitive.

In handball, Nigeria beat Ghana 29 to 16 to clinch the bronze medal. In the final that pitted Burkina Faso against Côte d'Ivoire, the Elephants of Côte took home gold, and the Stallions of Burkina Faso, silver.

In volleyball, and following their victory over Ghana by three sets to zero, Nigeria bagged gold, Ghana silver, and Burkina Faso, bronze, after edging Benin three sets to two in a very tight third place match.

# MAIDEN ANOCA ZONE 3 GAMES FOR THE FURTHERANCE OF PEACE

The logo of the Games, a dove decked out in the colours of the Olympic rings, symbolised peace. The mascot, a star bearing the logo of the Games, demonstrated Togo's commitment to peace. It showcased Togo as a model of peace,

The first ever ANOCA Zone 3 Games were organized based on an agreement signed between CNO-TOGO and ANOCA. Thanks to this ground-breaking collaboration, the event was held in keeping with international competition standards.

600 athletes were expected and their participation crowned organisational efforts and, above all, the desire to promote a healthy Olympic competition for African youth.

Togo, the host country, was chosen for its legendary hospitality, peace and security, and for promoting excellence in Olympism and sport.

The country also intended, through the maiden ANOCA Zone 3 Games, to take the celebration of Olympism and its values to an international level. And it was a huge sporting and organisational success, all to the credit of a sub-region faced with real security challenges.





According to NOC TOGO President Deladem AKPAKI, athletes are provided with the best conditions for "The qualifiers, which are not yet over. I hope Togo will participate in the Paris Olympic Games with many qualified athletes."

While hosting the maiden ANOCA Zone 3 Games, NOC TOGO spared no effort to ensure success, as NOC TOGO President Deladem AKPAKI noted in his closing remark: "...for success tomorrow, for

other zone games or other games that Togo will certainly have to host, this success will come from you. You who have devoted your time to learn how to manage sports. Keep up the good work. Meanwhile... there are other training courses offered by Olympic Solidarity."

Addressing volunteers, he added: "Dear volunteers, I would like to convey to you my special thanks. A special thank you because when we first wanted to launch





the Games, a lot of people came to see me and said President: What shall we do... to find people? I said we were going to launch a volunteer programme."

The closing address had been preceded by an opening speech by CNO-TOGO President, who had earlier indicated that: "I think we have a better future ahead of us... so let's make sure we sustain this competition so that we can stay together in the same spirit.


