


MONTHLY REVIEW OF AFRICAN OLYMPISM














With 100 days to D-day, more than 30 African countries have at least one athlete qualified for the Paris event.

Egypt currently boasts the highest number of athletes qualified, over 100. Other countries such as South Africa, Kenya and Nigeria have more than 30 athletes qualified already.

The 2024 Summer Olympics, commonly referred to as Paris 2024, are scheduled to take place from 26 July to 11 August 2024 in France, with Paris being the main host city and 16 other cities across mainland

France, plus a sub-venue in Tahiti – a French overseas Island in French Polynesia.

More athletes are expected to qualify for the 2024 Olympic Games in certain disciplines whose qualifiers are still ongoing.

EGYPT - Egypt has the highest number of athletes qualified in Africa. A total of 123 Egyptian athletes have confirmed



their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: archery, artistic swimming, boxing, canoeingkayaking, diving, horse-riding, fencing, football, handball, modern pentathlon, rowing, sailing, shooting, swimming, table tennis, taekwondo, volleyball and wrestling.

SOUTH AFRICA: 95 South African athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will compete in the following disciplines: archery, artistic swimming, athletics, cycling, canoeing, diving, horseriding, hockey, gymnastics, rowing, rugby, sports climbing, surfing, swimming and wrestling.

KENYA: 64 Kenyan athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: athletics, rugby sevens, tennis and volleyball.

MOROCCO: 44 Moroccan athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: athletics, boxing, canoeing-kayaking, horseriding, football, rowing, shooting, surfing, taekwondo and wrestling.

NIGERIA: 58 Nigerian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: athletics, basketball, boxing, canoeing, cycling, taekwondo and wrestling.

ALGERIA: 30 Algerian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: athletics, boxing, canoeing, cycling, fencing, gymnastics, rowing, sailing, shooting and wrestling.

ETHIOPIA: 30 Ethiopian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics.











ZAMBIA: 28 Zambian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in women's football, athletics and boxing.

TUNISIA: 21 Tunisian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in the following disciplines: archery, athletics, boxing, canoeing, rowing, shooting, swimming, taekwondo, tennis and wrestling.

ANGOLA: 20 Angolan athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in canoeing, handball, rowing and sailing.

MALI: 18 Malian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in football.

UGANDA: 15 Ugandan athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will compete in athletics, cycling and rowing.

SOUTH SUDAN: 12 South Sudanese athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in basketball.

CÔTE D'IVOIRE: 7 Ivorian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will compete in athletics, fencing and taekwondo.

ERITREA: 6 Eritrean athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics and cycling.

BOTSWANA: 5 athletes from Botswana have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics.

BURKINA FASO: 5 athletes from Burkina Faso have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics, cycling and taekwondo.

MAURITIUS: 4 Mauritian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics and cycling.

SENEGAL: 4 Senegalese athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics, fencing and taekwondo.

TANZANIA: 4 Tanzanian athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics.

RWANDA: 3 Rwandan athletes have confirmed their participation in Paris 2024 and will be competing in athletics and cycling.



They come from 56 National Olympic Committees.
Another complementary group will be announced at the end of the second qualifying tournament in Bangkok, which will take place from 25 May to 2 June 2024. More than 500 athletes will be competing for 51 places. Only NOCs that do not yet have any qualified athletes will be allowed to register one athlete per weight category.

188 ATHLETES ALREADY QUALIFIED FOR THE OLYMPIC BOXING TOURNAMENT

A total of 188 athletes from 56 NOCs secured their tickets for the Olympic boxing tournament at the Paris 2024 Games at the end of the first world qualifying tournament held in Busto Arsizio, Italy. The second and final world boxing qualifying tournament, to take place from 25 May to 2 June in Bangkok, Thailand, will be a final opportunity for boxers to qualify for this summer's Olympic Games. This update was given during the presentation of the unit in charge of boxing for the Paris 2024 Games to the IOC Executive Board. The meeting also discussed Boxing at future Olympic Games.

The qualifying tournaments for the Paris 2024 Games were organised under the authority



of the Boxing Unit, an ad hoc unit set up by the IOC Executive Board with a mandate to organise and hold Olympic qualifiers in boxing and boxing competitions at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. This followed the suspension and subsequent withdrawal of recognition of the International Boxing Association (IBA) by the IOC Session.

Speaking at the press conference following the IOC Executive Board meeting and citing





the IOC Executive Board, Kit McConnell, the Olympic body's Director of Sport, underscored that this is the last time such a process could be implemented by the IOC. Following the decision taken at last year's IOC Session, the inclusion of boxing in the LA28 Olympic programme is on hold and has not been confirmed. If there is no boxing body with the support and backing of the national federations, boxing may not be included in the Olympic programme.

"It is therefore up to the national federations to drive this change and work towards the creation of a body with which we can work in partnership, because we cannot move forward under the current state of affairs."

"The IOC Session, held in Mumbai in 2023, also made it clear that IBA will not be involved in the organisation of the boxing tournament in LA28, in the event that boxing is included in the sports programme."





QUALIFYING TOURNAMENTS

A total of 49 athletes (21 for women and 28 for men) booked their tickets during the first world boxing qualifiers held in Busto Arsizio (Italy) from 3 to 11 March 2024. One of them was refugee athlete, Cindy Ngamba, who is one of 70 refugee athletes on an Olympic Solidarity Scholarship.

The tournament was one of the biggest ever organised in boxing, with almost 600 athletes competing in 13 weight categories. It was a

crucial step in the boxing qualifiers for the Paris 2024 Games, following the continental qualification phase which took place in 2023.

Boxers will have a last chance to qualify for the Paris 2024 Games during the second world qualifying tournament, to be held in Bangkok, Thailand, from 25 May to 2 June. More than 500 athletes are expected to compete for the 51 available qualification tickets. In accordance with the boxing





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
qualification system for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, only NOCs that do not yet have an athlete qualified in a specific weight category via the corresponding continental qualification tournament will be allowed to register one athlete per weight category.

12 athletes selected by the International Olympic Committee are training in France ahead of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

They have been in France for a year thanks to the IOC Olympic Solidarity Scholarship. The athletes are from several African countries.

With the Olympic Solidarity grant they are provided boarding and lodging and above can train. They are supervised by top-level coaches. Speaking to French journalists, two Central African judokas noted:

Resquin Mongondo: "In our country, we don't have enough equipment to train. Here, we have many trainers and facilities. This allows us to better improve our judo and make progress,"

Jason Zacko adds: "the ultimate goal is to take part in the Paris 2024 Olympic Games".









The Zimbabwe Olympic Committee will be hosting the ANOCA Zone 6 Athletes' Forum on 12 and 13 April 2024. Delegates from the following 10 countries will take part in the deliberations: Namibia, Eswatini, Zambia, Malawi, Botswana, Lesotho, South Africa, Mozambique, Angola and Algeria. An expert from the British Olympic Association will equally take part in the deliberations. Discussions will focus on issues of collaboration, athlete development and leadership.


The Forum will take place in Victoria Falls.

NOC SAO TOME AND PRINCIPE REPORTS ON 2023 ACTIVITIES AND PREPARES FOR PARTICIPATION IN PARIS 2024 OLYMPIC GAMES

The Sao Tome and Principe Olympic and sports family met on Thursday 28 March 2024, during the General Assembly of the country's NOC. Issues discussed centered around the running of the institution, specifically the balance sheet of activities carried out in 2023, the establishment of the ethics and elections commissions, presentation and adoption of the accounts

for financial year 2023, plan of activities, presentation, scrutiny and adoption of the 2024 draft budget and adoption of the minutes of last year's General Assembly.

Preparation of athletes for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games was also a key item on the agenda.





Participants were also updated on athletes' preparation and qualification, as well as the administrative preparations in terms of support for all the stakeholders involved in Sao Tome and Principe's participation in the Olympic Games.

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The opening ceremony featured speeches by the NOC President, Joao Costa Alegre, and the Director General of Sports, Jorzita de Sousa, representing the Minister for Youth and Sports, Euridice Medeiros.

One of the major decisions taken was to set up an Ethics Committee comprising the following personalities: Naica Rosa, Marcelino de Sousa, Frederico da Gloria, Nedy Afonso and Sweetzer Batista.





The role of the Ethics Committee will be to regulate and intervene whenever a Federation or one of its members behaves inappropriately.

An Independent Electoral Commission was set up, with the following members: Frederico da Gloria, Ndey Afonso and Sweetzer Batista. They all have legal experience and a passion for sport. Their task will be to prepare for the elections to be held in 2025.

For the first time, the NOC General Assembly was organised in a totally green and sustainable environment, with clean energy, and without the use of paper, or plastic bottles, a real contribution to environmental protection.



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










































































































































