STRATEGIC PLAN

ANOCA FOR THE PERIOD 2021-2024, STRATEGIC, EFFICIENT AND PRODUCTIVE

working group has been set up by President Berraf to develop a strategic plan for the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa. The President himself set the pace for deliberations on 2 September 2020, during the maiden meeting of this task force. The said strategic plan



will run from 2021 to 2024, which is crucial quadrennial. The first draft of the strategic plan must be submitted to the President of ANOCA before 1st November 2020 pursuant to the mandate of the working group which runs from August to 30 November 2020.

The group is made up of experienced African sports administrators and officials who have undertaken to develop the strategic plan. It is Madam Mathlohang chaired by Moiloa-Ramogopo, third Vice President of ANOCA and President of NOC Lesotho who, speaking at the opening of deliberations, welcomed all participants and congratulated the President of ANOCA on what she deemed a wonderful initiative of the African Olympic and sports movement.

The curtain raiser was given on 2 September 2020 by ANOCA President, Moustapha Berraf, in the presence of 1st Vice President Joao Da Costa Alegre Afonso, 4th Vice President Fardouza Mousa Egueh, Secretary-General Ahmed Abouelgasim HASHIM and Treasurer General Habu GUMEL.

Also in attendance was Yassine Yousfi official in charge of coaches and Africa Director of Olympic Solidarity, who coopted into the working group to help develop the strategic plan.

The terms of reference were adopted, and the NOCs and other ANOCA stakeholders including IOC, Olympic Solidarity and ANOC will be consulted







in due course. The working group is tasked with the responsibilities to develop and produce a strategic plan for ANOCA, obtain relevant information to fine tune the strategic plan, make recommendations to the ANOCA Executive Committee through the Chairperson of the working group, regularly update the Executive Committee through the President.

IOC President, Thomas Bach, declared his support for the initiative and encouraged various members to do an excellent job in securing the destiny of the African Olympic Movement.

To tackle this task, the group decided to meet weekly. The next meeting will fine-tune the tools and templates that will be used by members during focus group meetings at zone level and to engage with various stakeholders. The task force also comprises members like Hamad Kalkaba Malboum, Vice Chair, Donald Rukare, Rapporteur and seven others including ANOCA zone representatives.

The coming years will help consolidate the significant progress made in many areas and focus on boosting support to National Olympic Associations so that they provide the best possible service to African athletes who will fly the continent's colours at major sports events across the world.

This approach is in line with Olympic Agenda 2020 and the fundamental principles of the Olympic Charter.

This new inspiration will open up to an environment very much affected



by the impacts of the terrible coronavirus pandemic that is still rocking the 2020 Olympic year, prompting the International Olympic Committee to reschedule the Tokyo Olympic Games in 2021.

ANOCA plans, at these games, to bring added impetus through high quality participation. This also holds for the organisation of the All Africa Games in Ghana in 2023, the African Youth Games in Lesotho in 2022, the Africa Beach Games and also the Youth Olympic Games in Dakar, Senegal in 2026.

The objective is to make Africa's participation a great success and

to raise ANOCA to the rank of best continental sports organisations that, in this specific case, promote Olympism and sport globally and in Africa in particular.

For sport development in Africa, the unity factor must be reinforced and to trigger other social, political and economic development factors for the welfare of Africans. It is thus incumbent on ANOCA to remind African States of the dire need for them to be fully involved and pay particular attention to sport development. Such is the thrust of the new strategy.
