foreign institutions such as Cuban and American NOCs, the International Federation of Volleyball, Slovenia, INSEP, etc. In the same vein, we must also strengthen relations with our usual partners which are the IOC, the Olympic Solidarity, ANOC, WADA, CONFEJES, the African Union... The extension of the Olympafrica Programme which should operate in all countries of the continent and the provision of equipment to existing centers will also be included in this quadrennial’s challenges. Other challenges to take up

will include the Africa Youth Games with the staging of the fourth edition in 2022 in Cairo, the holding of the second Africa Beach Games in 2022 in Hammamet, supporting the holding of the Dakar 2026 Youth Olympic Games and preparing the 2024 Paris games with the launching of our usual coordination and support programme at continental level. On this particular issue, we have to increase the amount allocated by ANOCA to better train African athletes.

Our institution’s role in the organization of the 2023 Africa Games in Accra should also be reaffirmed. In addition, the strengthening of relationships existing between our NOCs and governments should also be part of our priorities during this Olympiad. This will help us to develop adequate strategies to better finance sports in our respective countries, because without financial means, there are no infrastructure, no supervision, no equipment... We should always remember that financing sports is not a burden, but rather an





investment for our youths, the basis of our success.

Besides these achievements, we should also implement innovative actions to promote the practice of sports in Africa and to boost the African Olympic and Sports movement.

It is by taking up these challenges and many others together that we will continue to be athletes' strong allies, because they are the ones at the heart of the Olympic Movement's concerns. By 2024, we can do more; we must do more, together, for our eager and impatient youths. I am therefore launching an appeal to all of you! Let's build a new project for the African Olympic Movement, as it is crucial to carve the way leading to effective progress, to have a medium and long term vision for the good of our youths, to establish an innovative tradition geared towards high performance to make tomorrow's African sports as more competitive as possible.

THE 57TH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE ANOCA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CONVENED FOR 16 AND 17 MARCH IN CAIRO



By virtue of Article 24 of ANOCA's Constitution the 57th Ordinary session of this institution's Executive Committee will hold on 16 and 17 March 2022 in Cairo, Egypt. The venue will be the Concorde El Salam Hotel. From all indications, the meeting will consider progress reports of the Cairo 2022 4th Africa Youth Games and the Hammamet 2023 Africa Beach Games. Other items will feature on the agenda of this meeting, notably reports from the President, the

Secretary General and finance officials. ANOCA's calendar for 2022, the NOC headquarters project, the Olympafrica report, as well as an update on the ANOCA's Paris 2024 Athletes' Support Programme and the situation on the implementation of ANOCA's Strategic Plan are also included in the agenda of the meeting.

It should be noted that Cairo is the host town for the 4th Africa Youth Games to be held from 26 August to 6 September 2022.

4TH AFRICA YOUTH GAMES

IN ROAD FOR CAIRO 2022

From 26 August to 6 September 2022, Cairo, the capital of Egypt will pay host to the 4th edition of the Africa Youth Games. This event

was created by ANOCA in order to bring together, in the same venue, young boys and girls aged between 14 and 18 and coming from all parts of Africa. During this period, they compete in what will be for many of them the beginning of a rich and long sports career; Africa Youth Games having become the real melting pot, or even the main



breeding ground of continental sports. These games which are used to experiment the sports and culture binomial are also a platform for experience-sharing and ownership of Olympic values. The 2022 edition of the Africa Youth Games in Cairo is the wish expressed by Egyptian authorities, led by His Excellency Abdel Fattah El-Sisi who was awarded the "Gold" medal of the African Olympic Order of Merit,

the highest distinction of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa. In this special file, ANOCA Magazine's editorial team deeps you into the countdown of this event, six weeks ahead of the holding of this major gathering of the continent's youths.





THE RATIONALE BEHIND THE AFRICA YOUTH GAMES

In creating the Africa Youth Games, ANOCA intended to instill the sense of hard work, questioning, respect of the other, word of honour and sharing in participants who are spearheads of Africa. On a purely sports perspective, the competition aims at preparing those who will take over from today's champions. Africa Youth Games are not simply about sports; athletes also flood this event to take part in the proposed educative and cultural programme. Africa derives invaluable gains from these Games. From the philosophical point of view, youths from the continent acquire many values as giving the best of oneself or show proof of discipline; these values are beneficial to self-fulfillment,





non only on the playgrounds, but also beyond. Africa Youth Games play a crucial role in each participant's sports and personal development. They enable him to discover the Olympic world, the ambiance

around a major multisport event, as well as the Olympic spirit whose foundation is at the crossroads of other cultures, sharing and school of life.

On the cultural aspect, youths from the Continent strive to find the balance between the necessary focus for sports trials on the one hand, and the event's cultural and educative aspects on the other hand. The Continent's cultural heritage is also magnified on this occasion. On each edition since the first in 2010, Africa's cultural richness has been highlighted through exhibitions and various activities.

As far as sports are concerned, we have already seen participants at the Africa Youth Games becoming Olympic champions later.

INSIDE THE GAMES' PIONEER EDITIONS

The Africa Youth Games were born from the ANOCA Games organized in 2006 at the level of the association's development zones. The aim of the African Olympic Movement's body then was to put to trial this concept through the organization of sports competitions among youths aged from 14 to 18. These ANOCA Games were widely adhered to by sportsmen and women, their officials and even States authorities of several African countries.

Following the success recorded in sports and organizational levels in the zones concerned, ANOCA management decided to organize an event at the same place and at the same time, in order to further bring the continent's young athletes closer, to make them more competitive and to increase the number of sports disciplines.

FIRST ATTEMPT... BRILLIANT!



It was from 13 to 18 July 2010 that young Africans met in Rabat for the first edition of games offered to them by ANOCA. The event

took place in several stages and steps.

The sports competition: participants took part in many





events in the following sports: athletics, rowing, basketball, boxing, canoeing, cycling, fencing, football, gymnastics, weightlifting, judo, wrestling, swimming, le taekwondo, shooting, le triathlon, tennis, table tennis and beach volley. Technical rules for sports





on the games schedule were developed in collaboration with continental sports confederations.

The cultural aspect of these games included many spaces including: the internet workshop, the radio animation



workshop, the plastic arts workshop, the choreography workshop, the Karaoke workshop and a crafts gallery. In addition to these permanent settings, many other activities were organized: a night around a campfire, an intercultural evening where various delegations were presented,

cultural exchanges through traditional dances and open-public animations.

Statistics reveals key figures: 42 delegations, 1008 athletes with a total of 2300 persons accredited.

The second edition of the Africa Youth Games kept all its promises in Gaborone from 22 to 31 May 2014, with an outstanding attendance of 54 countries among which the continent's newborn, South Sudan

which gained independence on 9 July 2011. ANOCA worked in synergy with the Association of African Sports Confederations (AASC) and the Local Organizing Committee (BAYGOC) to guarantee a resounding success of the

event which brought together 2500 athletes. For about ten days, athletes displayed their strength and courage in 21 sports disciplines and in about ten different venues. A strong cultural activity was the second major component of this event,

in addition to information, education and communication activities on the fight against doping. The Gaborone Games came to an end on 31 May 2014 at the Gaborone National Stadium in a carnival-like atmosphere, in the presence





of IOC President, Thomas Bach, ANOCA's guest of honour. The closing ceremony was marked by the spectacular entry of volunteers and delegations in the stadium. Then, in a mood of great feast, medals were handed to winners of the last athletics events.

Undoubtedly, they were at the heart of Algiers 2018, and they showed proof of talent and dignity to contribute in the organization of this popular event according to the very vision of ANOCA, which perceives volunteering as a concentration of individual and collective energy at the service of others.



LET'S GET ACQUAINTED WITH... THE AFRICA YOUTH GAMES



The Africa Youth Games are a sport event linking sport, education and culture. It is a catalyst of sports, educational and cultural initiatives in favour of youths. By creating this multisport event, ANOCA's vision was to encourage youths to practice sports, to adopt and live according to Olympic values. The African Sports Movement's governing body then committed itself, through this platform, to stage

an event aimed at educating, mobilizing and encouraging young athletes to play an active role within their communities. The objectives of Africa Youth Games are as follows:

Bring together and celebrate the continent's best young athletes.

This event is organized every

four years, during approximately 12 days, usually on the year of the Summer Youth Olympic Games, and is attended by young Africans aged between 14 and 18. Statistics show an average attendance of 2,500 athletes and 1,000 officials. It should be noted that during the games, participants stay for all the duration of the event and attend all programmes. At





infrastructural level, a Youths village is built with a capacity of 5,000 beds, as well as hotels

with a capacity of 1,000 rooms, and with a shuttle service for all and a limited car service.

At the level of sports, the competitions programme stresses on sports selected for the Winter Youth Olympic Games; standards for juniors are set by African Confederations (ACs). Furthermore, “young officials” from ACs are encouraged to participate.

It is worth noting that as concerns the qualification system for the YOG, NOCs select athletes and team officials, and qualifiers are made from ACs’ existing disciplines.

The second component of the Youth Africa Games includes a Culture and Education Programme aimed at learning and sharing. This programme highlights the continental youths’ talents while magnifying the huge cultural heritage the cradle of Humanity is endowed with.

Since their inception, the Youth Africa Games have already been hosted in Rabat (2010), Gaborone (2014) and Algiers (2018).



139TH SESSION OF THE IOC

MUSTAPHA BERRAF ATTENDS THE 139TH SESSION OF THE IOC



The 139th session of the International Olympic Committee took place on 3 and 19 February 2022 at the China National Convention, on the sidelines of the Winter Olympic Games. Opening the meeting, IOC President, Dr. Thomas Bach said that the Beijing 2022 Winter Olympic Games would mark the opening of a new era for winter sports in the world, with more than 300 millions of Chinese people practicing winter sports. In his speech, he also took stock of the last Tokyo Olympic Games and hailed the job achieved by the

Peking Winter Olympic Games organizers which thus becomes the first city to organize both the summer and winter Olympic Games. « **China has become today a summer sports country** », he proudly said. IOC President also came back on « **boycott ghosts who reappeared** », while pointing out that eventually, « **all athletes were able to fulfill their dream of taking part in these Games** ». Recalling that issues of peace of wars were the prerogatives of States, he acknowledged the support from the G20 and that of the UN's 193 member nations in favour





of the Olympic Truce. **« This is the duty of the Olympic Games, that of bringing everybody together around a peaceful competitions; bringing together humanity in all its diversity, building bridges, never erecting walls (...) Games are this peace and unity symbol, opening the way for a peaceful future. That is why I am calling on all leaders of the world to keep their commitment to respect the Olympic Truce ».** At the end of his speech, many speakers took the floor, including ANOCA President, Mustapha Berraf, who reiterated his institution's position. According to him, this will cause **« severe damages and would endanger sport ».**

He also talked about **« the physical and moral consequences on football players who are not robots, but rather human beings »**; on the same occasion, he frowned at the widening of the gap **« between men and women competitions »**, as well as the overstuffing of the international sport calendar. Other member

of the Olympic body recalled the consequences this unilateral decision may have on the sport calendar, and on athletes' health. Thomas Bach, who shares the same position, underscored that Gianni Infantino (IOC Member and President of the International Football Federation Association) had cancelled this decision at the last moment during his trip to Peking. He preferred that the debate be carried out directly with him. The meeting further unanimously approved the change of the Los Angeles Olympic Games programme: formerly considered as additional sports, skate, surf and climbing will henceforth be full-fledged sports in the place of boxing, weightlifting and modern pentathlon. These three sports can however be reintroduced the 2028 Games programme provided that efforts are made in matters of governance for the former or transparency for pentathlon.

ANOCA President, Mustapha Berraf, presented his institution's annual report to the ANOC Executive Council which took place in Peking on

6 February. He thanked the IOC and China for the perfect hosting of the Beijing 2022 Winter Games.

He then presented ANOCA's

action since the last meeting held in Greece in October 2021. These include Executive Committee sessions, the implementation of the 2021-2024 Strategic Plan, the 38th Seminar for member NOCs Secretaries General organized in Niger, the preparation and staging of the Egypt 2022 Africa Youth Games, the 2nd Beach Games to be held in Hammamet, Tunisia, still in 2022, partnerships entered

into for the empowerment of the continent's youths, Commissions activities, Olympafrica development, just to name a few.

Concluding his address, Mustapha Berraf thanked ANOC President, Robin Mitchell and Secretary General Gunilla Lindberg for all initiatives put in place in favour of African NOCs.



AFCON TOTAL ENERGIES

ANOCA ASSESSES THE 2021 AFCON TOTAL ENERGIES





The African Football Cup of Nations took place from 9 January to 6 February 2022 in Cameroon. The competition presented the best image of Olympic values as perceived on the African continent. The last and first time the country hosted this competition dates back 50 years ago. Cameroon organized the 8th African Football Cup of Nations in 1972.

The 2021 edition which was played in 2022 due to the Coronavirus pandemic

highlighted the values of fair-play, esteem, surpassing oneself and respect of the opponent.

On 6 February 2022, the final was won at the Yaounde Olembé stadium by the « **Teranga Lions** » of Senegal who defeated Egypt at the final shoot outs. This was the first trophy ever won by Senegal.

Host country Cameroon portrayed one of the nicest pictures of a united Africa, very respectful of Olympic values.



The construction of beautiful infrastructure in Garoua,

Limbe, Yaounde, Bafoussam and Douala, cities selected matches, is a great gift made to the entire African youths. Mustapha Berraf, President of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa (ANOCA), with his extensive experience as sports manager and senior official of the African Governing Olympic Movement's body had this to say:

WORLD WOMEN AND SPORTS TROPHY

HASHIMOTO SEIKO RECEIVES A REWARD



During its 139th session held in Beijing, the International Olympic Committee awarded its « **Women and Sports** » trophies to six advocates of gender equality. This distinction is given each year at world and continental level to exceptional personalities who work for gender equality. Founded in the year 2000, IOC « **Women and Sports** » Trophies reward exemplary personalities and people who work for

change and add their voice for the promotion of gender equality and inclusion. Six are handed each year – one for each of the five continents and one at world level – in order to reward laureates' outstanding contribution to women and young girls' participation in the sports movement.

Accordingly, the 2021 world trophy went to the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games Organizing





Committee President, Hashimoto Seiko. As seasoned sports leader, influent politician and seven times Olympian, Hashimoto Seiko upset and put to question many gender standards deeply rooted within Japanese society to push forward gender equality and inclusiveness in sport. Her trophy was personally handed to her by IOC President, Dr. Thomas Bach, and the President of the Women and Sports Commission, Lydia Nsekera.

During the same ceremony, both officials also published the names of continental Trophies' recipients:

Winner for Africa: Natsiraishe Maritsa (Zimbabwe)

Winner for America: Figure Skating in Harlem Organization (United States)

Winner for Asia: Zhang Xia (China)

Winner for Europe: Kari Fasting (Norway)

Winner for Oceania: Tracey Holmes (Australia)

Talking about the contribution

of sport in gender equality, President Thomas Bach said: « ***One of the successes to put at the credit of the 2022 Tokyo Olympic Games is that they were the most balanced Games in history in terms of men to women representation. We, at the IOC, contributed through appropriate qualification systems and places. I wish to use this opportunity to express my gratitude to International Federation for their unflinching support which helped us to go through this crucial phase (...) our objective is not only to push gender equality forward within and outside competition fields, but also to empower women and girls through sport. NATSIRAI SHE MARITSA FROM ZIMBABWE REWARDED



Africa's winner of the 2021 edition of the Women and Sports trophy is Natsiraishe Maritse from Zimbabwe. Her application was proposed by International Federation of Taekwondo (World Taekwondo). The latter then contacted Zimbabwe's Taekwondo Federation and Korean Foundation for the Promotion of Taekwondo so that a consignment of equipment and supplies to be

sent to support the cause of teenager.

Natsiraishe Maritsa thus uses taekwondo make boys and girls in her community more responsible and more confident. Moved by the alarming number of children's marriages in Zimbabwe, through her activity, she launched the Vulnerable Underaged People's Auditorium Initiative. Through this project, she uses



her passion for taekwondo to lesson youths and offer them a space where they could express their concerns

and experiences, and also discuss issues such as early pregnancies, violence or gender –based harassment.

MUSTAPHA BERRAF CLARIFIES ANOCA'S POSITION



BEIJING 2022™



Reacting to the call launched by some political groups for the boycott of the Beijing 2022 winter Olympic Games, ANOCA President, Mustapha Berraf, in an interview granted to CNC and CCTV two news organs, made his institution's position clear. According to him, « **politics should not interfere with sport. It should stay at bay of sports events,**

which remains an opportunity for youths and peoples to make peace, brotherhood and love triumph in the world ». For the IOC member, « **The first organization to have supported the staging of these games in Beijing is our organization (ANOCA ed.). This is a special message from ANOCA of which I am the senior representative, where some said that it was**





not the time to stage these games or other allegations, who wanted to politicize the issue ».

In line with the practice of sports, ANOCA President pointed out that: *« These interferences could not be included in an issue relating to youths, joy, results and performance. Set goals are sports goals and we should stick to that. I have already traveled to Beijing in 2008 during the Olympic and I was impressed. Likewise, I hope the next games will also be successful ».* *« As all African delegations, I'm expecting an unchallenged editions since the Games were founded. I know what Chinese are capable of. The Chinese Government and people have huge means and skills and we are proud of our presence and participation, though symbolic »*, he went further.

On Africa's participation ANOCA President explained

that *« given its climate, Africa lacked enough opportunities in terms of disciplines relating to winter games ».*

Mustapha Berraf encouraged to countries to participate in these games, *« organized in this brotherly country which helps Africa a lot. Therefore, it is a duty to also scratch the back of this generous nation which accepted to host these games and give them a special touch ».* *« We have an Olympafrica Foundation owning 50 complexes all over the continent. We will request the contribution of our Chinese brothers to help these young talents who lack means. These are millions of youths we are preparing through these complexes »*, said Mr. Berraf, alluding to the possible signing of a partnership agreement with the Chinese Olympic Committee to support African Athletes.

ANOCA ZONE 1 SETS 2022 SPORTS AND OLYMPIC AGENDA



MINUTES OF ZONE 1 MEETING

Date: 18 February 2022

Venue: Headquarters of NOC Tunisia

At the behest of the President of ANOCA Zone 1, Mr Khaled Zankouli, a meeting was held

at the Headquarters of NOC Tunisia on Friday, 18 February 2022 at 4 p.m.

Apart from the Zone 1 President himself, the meeting was also attended by the President of NOC Libya, Mr Jamel Zarrouk, and the President of NOC Tunisia, Mr Mehrez Bousayne. The Secretary-General of NOC Algeria, Mr Khereiddine Berbari,



followed it via Zoom, while the representative of NOC Morocco apologised for not being able to attend. He nonetheless expressed his confidence in the President of the Zone and the participants after reading the agenda, and declared his support for the ensuing resolutions.

Following deliberations on the organisation of Zone 1 Beach Games as a «test event» for the 2nd African Beach Games billed for Hammamet (Tunisia) in 2023, the participants decided as follows:

1. To organise the Zone 1 Beach Games in Tunisia on a date to be decided later, together with the events, number of athletes and delegations.
2. Mr Chaker Belhaj, sports director of NOC Tunisia, was tasked to prepare a technical document to be submitted to the Zone 1 President by the end of February, taking into account the budget allocated to the games.

Winners shall receive incentives as encouragement



to participate, provided the budget so permits.

3. To examine the possibility of having Mauritania and Egypt participate in the Zone I Games

4. To request for the transfer, by the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa, of the budget reserved for Zone 1 to the bank account of NOC Tunisia, while reserving an account receivable in the NOC Tunisia account for Zone 1. Expenditure shall be authorised in writing by the Zone 1 President. The account and its management shall be the responsibility of

the Zone and its President to serve as a support document for the drafting of its annual financial report.

5. Désignation de la prochaine Choice of Tripoli as venue for the next Zone 1 meeting on a date to be decided later, with the commitment of NOC Libya to organise it before March 2022.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 p.m.
